Shadows, Silhouettes & Reflections

Description:

- Shadows: an area that is not or is only partially irradiated or illuminated because of the interception of radiation by an opaque object between the area.
- Silhouettes: the outline of a solid figure as cast by its shadow.
- Reflections: something, such as light, radiant heat, sound, or an image, that is reflected....

Research:

- Brainstorm possible shadows, silhouettes and reflections imagery. Where are interesting locations you can possibly shoot 2 shadows, silhouettes and reflections photos?
- Research online tips on shooting shadows, silhouettes and reflections. Include the tips in your research section for this project. Be specific! Pay attention to particular camera settings that will help you achieve your goal.
- Draw 3 conceptual sketches of possible ideas for your shadows, silhouettes and reflections. Include particulars such as light position, camera, model, etc.

Process:

- Get approval from the teacher for your concepts as mentioned in the above research.
- Photograph your chosen imagery: 2 shadows, 2 silhouettes and 2 reflections photos.

Journal:

- What part of your finished project did you find most successful and why?
- What part of your finished project did you find least successful and why?
- If you had to do this project again, what part would you change or improve on and why?
