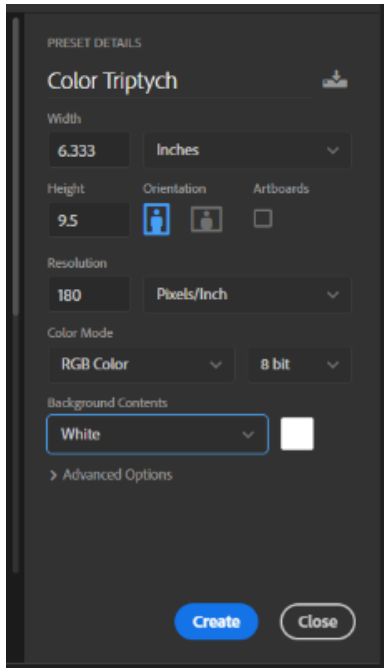

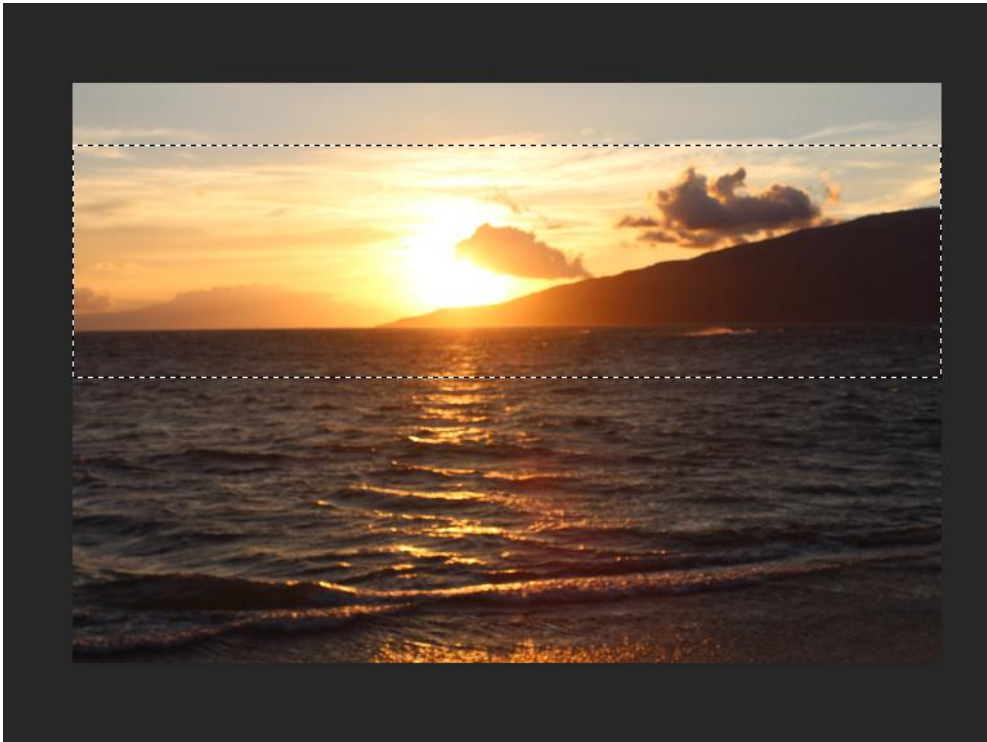


PHOTOSHOP INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMBINING IMAGES FOR THE TRIPTYCH:

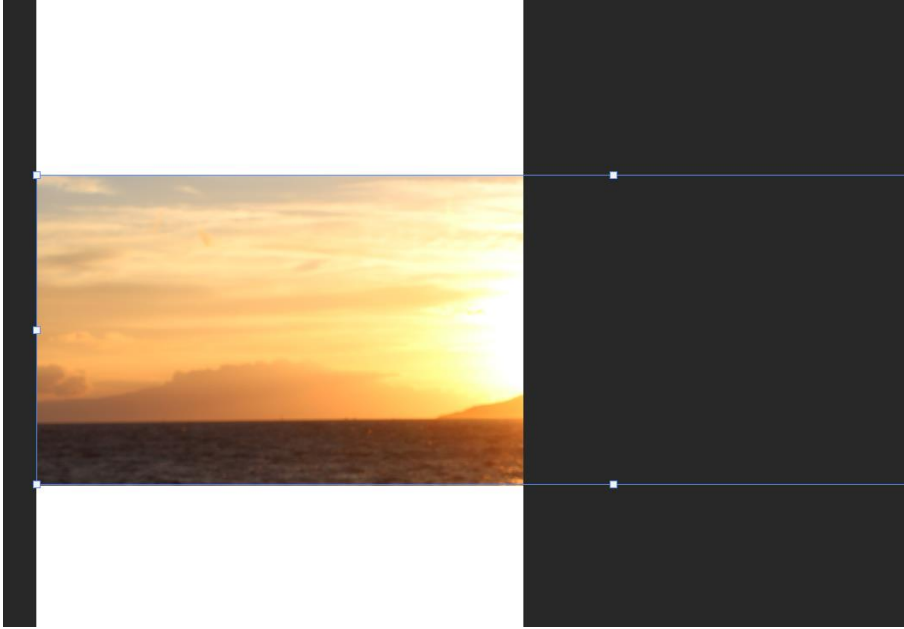
1. Create a new Photoshop Document that is 6.333 inches wide, 9.5 inches high, and 180 resolution. Use a white background for content.



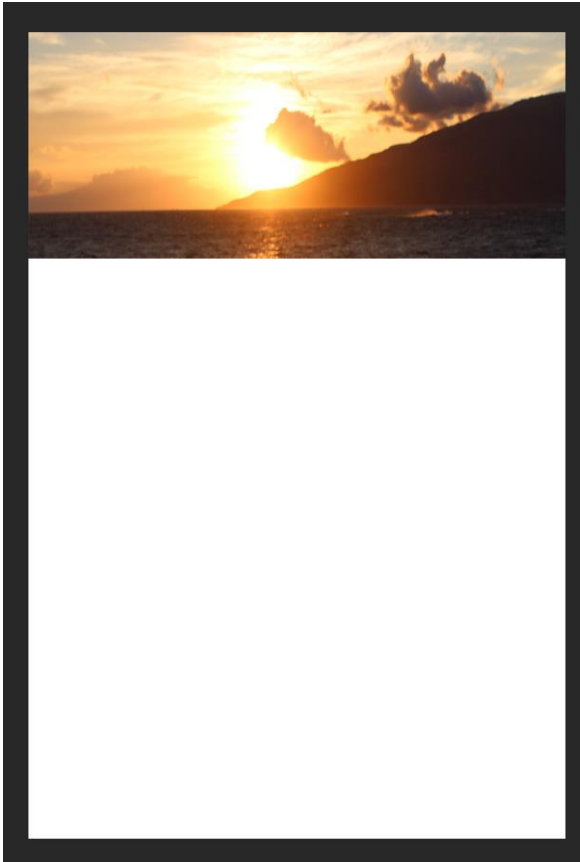
2. Open your original photos and then go to Image/Image Size and change the resolution to 180.
3. Using the Marquee tool,  select the part of the image you want to cut out of the image and then choose Edit/Copy (ctrl c).



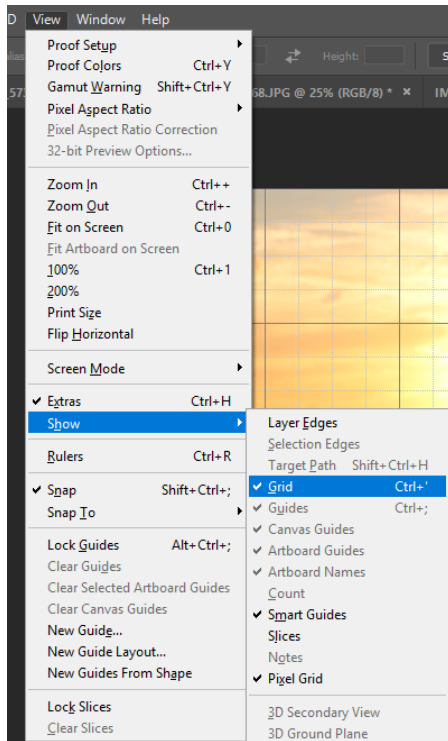
4. Paste your selected image into your Color Triptych (ctrl v)
5. To resize and move your selection, choose Edit/Free Transform (ctrl T)



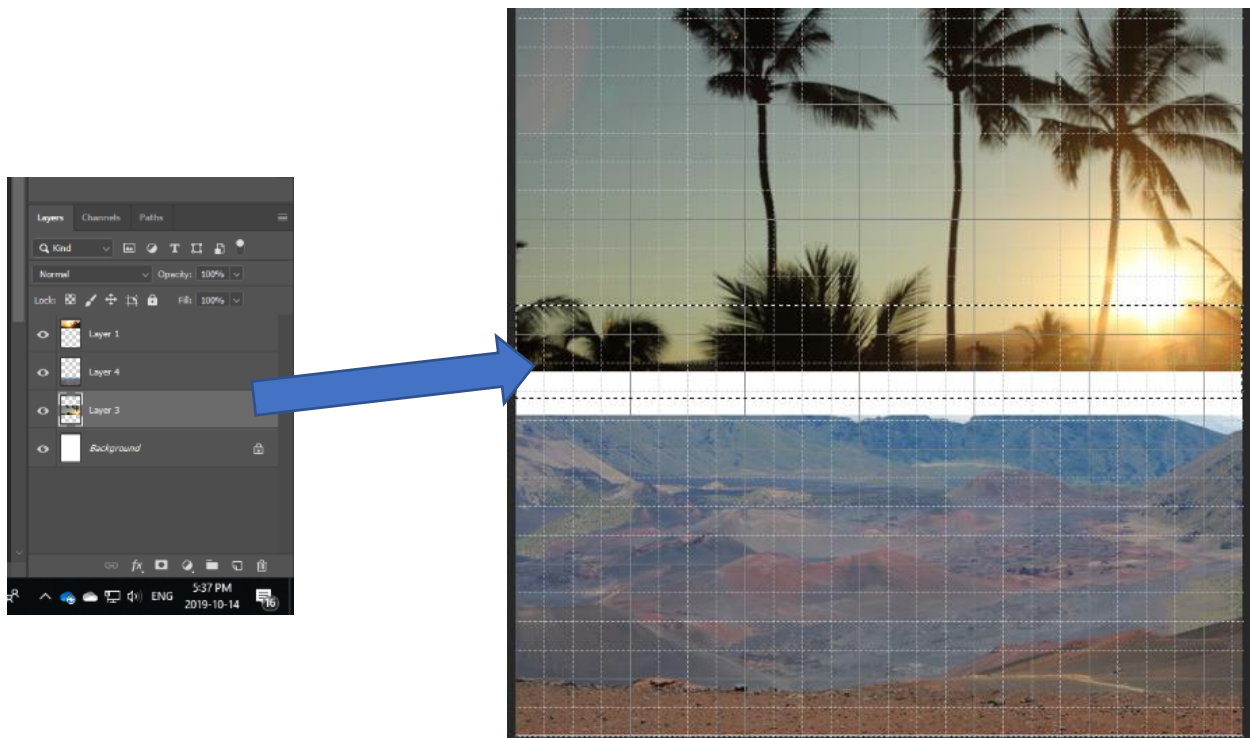
6. You might need to zoom out. Ctrl + and – will zoom in and out of the document.
7. Resize the image and move it where you want it.



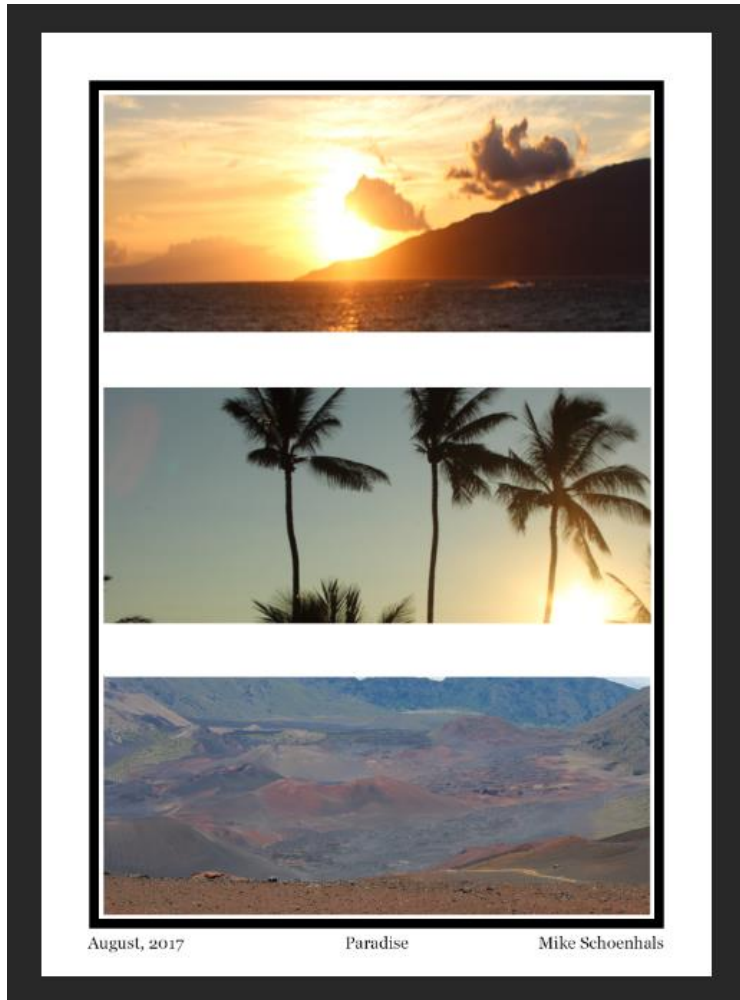
8. Don't leave white space anywhere except between the 3 images
9. You might find it helpful to use the Photoshop grid as the 3 images should be of similar sizes. To turn on the grid, choose View/Show/Grid. Make sure "Extras" is check marked in the View menu.



10. You most likely will need to trim a little from each photo to fit them all together in Photoshop. Use the Marquee tool and make sure you are on the right layer of your triptych.



11. Delete the selected area using the Delete button on the keyboard.
12. Now add the frame using the Photoshop Workflow document: 20 pixels of white, 40 pixels of black, then 200 pixels of white.



13. DONE!
